1. For your competition number please read the entry list.
2. Signing on will commence at 07:30 and finish at 09.15.
3. Competitors are reminded that ALL Competition Licences and Club Membership Cards will be examined at signing on.
4. Competitors must hold a valid membership for Truro & District Motor Club, or a membership for any member club of the ASWMC, the Aston Martin Owners club or the VSCC.
5. There will be a driver briefing at 09.00 near the signing on office – **ALL** drivers **MUST** attend.
6. The course will be open for competitors to walk from 07.30. Please be aware of organiser, display and resident traffic during this period. Competitors will have **one** practice run S2.1, S9. Immediately following practice three competitive timed runs will commence, additional timed runs will be taken if time permits. All timed runs will count for awards. For the event on Sunday 19th June competitors who competed on the previous day may if they wish not take any practice runs.
7. Where class minimum numbers have not been reached the organisers will amalgamate classes as necessary for the purpose of the event, please see the official notice board at signing on for confirmation of your class structure. The organisers will ensure that the results sent to the ASWMC, Cornish Speed Championship, Torbay Speed Championship and Richards Bros Speed Championship will reflect the classes in the event regulations.
8. There will be a number of penalty cones placed on the inside of Carlyon Curve (the right hand bend), they will be clearly defined and coloured (black and yellow). A driver whose car hits any one of these cones during his/her practice or competitive timed run will have a **one second** penalty added, per cone, to his/her time. There will be a number of 'Non Penalty' cones placed on the inside of Healey Hairpin in order to stop competitors from cutting the bend and depositing dirt onto the track.
9. Awards:
Saturday 18th - **FTD** – awarded to the competitor with the fastest time of the day the – Eric Preston Trophy.
Sunday 19th – **FTD** – awarded to the competitor with the fastest time of the day the – Speedsport Design Trophy.
1st in Class – awarded to the fastest vehicle in each class subject to a minimum of 3 starters.
2nd in Class – awarded to the 2nd fastest competitor subject to a minimum of 5 starters in the class.
3rd in Class – awarded to the 3rd fastest competitor subject to 8 starters in the class.

No competitor may win more than one award.

Academy entrants are not eligible for any class awards; however, the club will award the Treburley Garage Trophy to the best improver over the ten academy events. The award will be given to the academy entrant who improves the greatest on that of his / her first timed run.

All awards will be presented at the Truro Motor Club annual awards presentation to be held on a date to be announced and venue to be advised. Awards will NOT be sent out in the post. The FTD awards will be held for 11 months and recipients must return the award during November 2022.

11. Competitors will park in the competition numbered parking bay for their vehicle; the race box / trailer (if applicable) should be placed in front or alongside as directed. The paddock may have various areas roped off due to tree damage, please do not enter these areas.
12. Competitors are reminded that competition numbers must clearly be displayed in line with S9.2.5, J4.1. Double drivers will also display 'A' as a suffix letter, while Truro Speed Academy entrants will display 'T' as a prefix letter. These letters will be approximately half the size of their competition numbers.
13. Other cars and marshals will be directed to a suitable parking area within the general paddock area.
14. Tyre warming is permitted in the designated area below the paddock exit and start line subject to S9.3.1 Please do **NOT** spin your wheels in the paddock exit and await your turn as directed.
15. Competitors are invited to add to the Marshal Raffle draw, by contributing a prize, Please deliver to Secretary of Meeting. The club would appreciate competitors encouraging marshals to attend the meeting.
16. Competitors camping overnight are reminded to pay the Event Secretary £7.50 per night. Cheques made payable to Truro and District Motor Club LTD. Drinking water available on site. **No** fires to be lit on site. Camping is available from Friday.
17. The club has a footpath direct from the paddock around the parkland to the top spectator area, you might find useful for access to top of the hill.
18. Please complete the competitor's information sheet sent out to you to enable the commentator to accurately inform spectators of you and your vehicle.

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Event Health and Safety Notes

Health and Safety legislation is intended to ensure, so far as reasonably practical, that your health, safety and welfare is protected. Everyone has a duty of care to protect themselves and others.

GENERAL:

- Please keep within the areas being used by Truro Motor Club, the Parkland and top paddock only.
- Tregrehan Estate parkland is used for animal grazing and other wildlife when not used by the Motor Club. Please be aware of animal faeces or hazards such as holes etc.
- Children must be under direct control of an adult whilst on site at all times.
- Other than when competing on the hill please keep to 5 mph speed limit.
- Please ensure that the parking of motor homes, caravans etc is kept at a safe distance, and that nuisance noise levels are kept to a minimum.
- Please ensure that BBQs, stoves etc are used responsibly with due regard to prevailing winds etc. On no account must such items be lit in the open during the event.
- Any accidents, injuries or damage to property not related to on-track activities to be reported to the Secretary of the Meeting.
- In the event of an emergency please heed any instructions given over the public address system.
- Please ensure that the area is left tidy and undisturbed by the event, and that the area is free of all rubbish, litter and other objects.

COMPETITORS:

- In common with most hillclimb venues spectators have access to the paddock area, please ensure that your pit areas are kept free of trip hazards and all equipment is kept secure.
- Store fuel in approved containers and appropriately marked.
- Vehicle re-fuelling should only be undertaken in the paddock area and competitors should take all necessary steps to ensure the immediate area is clear and free of sources of ignition and smoking. Competitors should have a fire extinguisher readily available during re-fuelling.
- Any hazardous chemicals should be kept in appropriate conditions secure from accidental access by third parties.

MARSHALS:

- Manual handling of vehicles is to be avoided where possible and lifting gear utilised.
- Where an assessment of the risk indicates that manual handling is required, safe lifting techniques are to be used as instructed during marshal training.
- Personal Protective Equipment (clothing) should be worn when on duty, and use of the marshal tabards made where appropriate.
