

CORNISH SPEED CHAMPIONSHIP 2023

1. SPORTING REGULATIONS - GENERAL

1.1 Title & Jurisdiction:

The CORNISH SPEED Championship is organised and administered by Camel Vale Motor Club (CVMC), and co-promoted by Newquay Auto Club (NAC), Plymouth Motor Club (PMC) and Truro & District Motor Club (TDMC) in accordance with the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Championship Regulations.

1.2 Officials:

- 1.2.1 Co-ordinator: Ian Harrison Higher Widemouth Farm, Widemouth Bay, Bude EX23 0DE
- 1.2.2 Eligibility Scrutineer: Mr John Cooper
- 1.2.3 Championship Stewards: Mrs Pam Hartill, Mr Chris Jarman, Mr John SlumanMr Tony Wood. 3 out of 4 Championship Stewards will adjudicate

1.3 Competitor Eligibility:

- 1.3.1 Entrants must be fully paid up valid membership card holding members of one of the organising clubs, (see 1.1) and be in possession of an appropriate 2023 Motorsport UK Competition Licence.
- 1.3.2 Drivers and Entrant/Drivers must be fully paid up valid membership card holding members of one of the organising clubs (see 1.1), be registered for the championship and be in possession of a 2023 Competition RS Interclub Status Licence, as a minimum.

A competitor shall not take time off school to participate in motor sport without the prior written approval of their school. If participation in the Championship requires absence from school, drivers in full time school education are required to have the approval of their head teacher and a letter stating such approval from his/her school in order to fulfil registration for the Championship.

1.3.3 All necessary documentation must be presented for checking at all rounds when signing-on.

1.4 Registration:

- 1.4.1 Competitors registering for the Championship must declare the following details to the Co-Ordinator either by completing the online form available on each club's website or on a paper copy of the Championship Registration form:
 - a) Full name
 - b) Full address
 - c) The organising Club of which they are, or will be, a member during the Championship year
- 1.4.2 Fee £10 per entry.

1.4.3 Competitors are permitted to change class during the year and championship points will be Amalgamated. However only one set of points may be claimed at any event

1.6 Scoring:

1.6.1 All events will be qualifying rounds of the Championship with the best 9 results used to calculate overall positions. In the event that the total number of available rounds falls to 12 then the best 8 results to count, to 10 or 11 then the best 7 results to count etc, If any meeting(s) fail to run, then an event(s) of the same type may be substituted either at an existing or alternative venue. Additional events may be included at the organisers' discretion. Adequate notice will be given in these instances in accordance with the Motorsport UK Yearbook. Registered championship contenders will be provided with stickers which must be displayed on each side of the competing vehicle(s) at each Championship event.
Results for each round will be calculated as follows:

Championship points will be awarded to registered contenders as follows:First in class – 20 points <u>plus</u> 0.01 point(s) for every 0.01 second(s) the time <u>betters</u> that of the second placed class finisher up to a maximum of 22 points.(If there is only one finisher in the class, then 20 points will be awarded). Second in class– 20 points. All remaining contenders in class: 20 points <u>less</u> 0.01 point(s) for each 0.01sec that their time is <u>exceeds</u> that of the second placed finisher. The minimum score shall be 1 point. In addition to the above scoring system any contender who breaks the existing Class record at a venue will be awarded an additional 0.01 point(s) for each 0.01 second(s) their time beats the record up to a maximum of 1 point. The Class record shall be the record in the relevant class at the start of each meeting. Where no previous Class record exists then a new Class record will be set at the first Championship event that takes place at the venue in 2023

- 1.6.2 A tie shall be decided by counting the competitor's next best result(s). If this still does not resolve the tie then the competitor with greatest number of class wins amongst their eligible results shall be declared the winner.
- 1.6.3 Championship Points Appeal C6.5.

1.7 Awards:

- 1.7.1 The number of awards will be proportional to the number of contenders in the Championship, to a maximum of 5. according to the following table
 - 1 3 Contenders scoring First Place only
 - 4 7 Contenders scoring First & 2nd places
 - 8 –15 Contenders scoring First 3 places
 - 16 25 Contenders scoring First 4 places
 - 25 & over Contenders scoring First 5 places No competitor may win more than one award.
- 1.7.2 Details of the number and levels of awards will be advised as soon as practicable after the closing date for entry to the Championship.

3. TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

The Championship is open to four-wheeled vehicles either with a current MotorsportUK / MSA Logbook or currently registered for road use.

- A0 Junior Driver Class competing in Standard Cars up to 1400cc
- A1. Road Cars Series Production up to 1400cc
- A2. Road Cars Series Production over 1400cc up to 1800cc
- A3. Road Cars Series Production over 1800cc up to 2600cc
- A4. Road Cars Series Production over 2600cc

Road Cars Specialist Production

- B1. Road Cars Specialist Production . Car engines up to 1400cc
- B2. Road Cars Specialist Production. Car engines over 1400cc up to 1800cc
- B3. Road Cars Specialist Production . Car engines over 1800cc & all Motor Cycle engines

Modified Cars Series/Specialist Production

- C1. Modified Cars Series Production up to 1400cc
- C2. Modified Cars Series Production over 1400cc up to 1800cc
- C3. Modified Cars Series Production over 1800cc
- C4. Modified Cars Specialist Production Car & Motor Cycle engines

Sports Libre Cars

- D1. Sports Libre Cars up to 1800cc

- Note 1: All cars must comply with S.10.2.1-10.2.8.
- Note 2 Junior Class drivers and cars must comply with S7.1.9 S7.1.9.2
- **Note 3**: Road Cars Series Production are defined as cars complying with S.12.1.1,-12.8.1. Road Cars Specialist Production are defined as cars complying with S.12.1.2 12.7.7 Modified Cars Series Production are defined as cars complying with S.13.,- 13.9. Must have been available to the general public and originally designed for use on the public highway in road legal form. It must have been manufactured in the required production numbers 1000 per year.

Modified Cars Specialist Production are defined as cars complying with S.13.2, 13.3-13.5, 13.6.2, 13.6.3-13.9. Must have been available to the general public and originally designed for use on the public highway in road legal form. It must have been manufactured in the required production numbers 20 per year.

Sports Libre Cars must comply with S.14 and Racing cars with S.15.

Rally Cars must comply with R.46-49 and S.14. Included in the latter Category would be

Group B cars, any cars without the original engine block of the model entered, and car with a transmission layout not as originally specified for that model, or a Specialist Rally Car without an engine complying with S.13.6.2. They need not be taxed.

Note 4: The onus of responsibility for the eligibility of vehicles competing in the championship rests with the Entrant/Competitor. In the event of a dispute concerning the compliance of a vehicle to the regulations, the onus will be on the competitor to satisfy the organisers, NOT the organisers to prove compliance.

3.3 Safety Requirements

All vehicles are to comply with the safety requirements as per Sections J & K of the Motorsport UK Yearbook 2023

- 3.4 Due to both safety and environmental concerns, vehicles **must not** be left unattended under any circumstances when the engine is running.
- 4 Tyre wrapping with single use plastic is not allowed during the events.
- 5. SPECIFIC CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS
- By registering for the Championship all competitors and their associates commit to positively promote and demonstrate the Motorsport UK's Respect Code which is appended to these regulations (Appendix 1).
 - 5.1.1. Where any reports of disrespectful conduct are judged to be well founded the Championship organisers may issue warnings or require remedial actions and/or report the matter to the Championship Stewards who may impose appropriate penalties which can include loss of Championship points and/or race bans through to Championship Expulsion and referral to Motorsport UK.
 - 5.1.2. It is imperative that we promote the safety and wellbeing of young people and adults at risk. In addition to this all participants must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times and abusive language and harmful behaviour will not be tolerated. Any such incidents must be reported to the Championship Coordinator and/or Safeguarding Officer who will also relay the report Motorsport UK.  - 5.1.3 All breaches of the Race with Respect Code will be reported to Motorsport UK
